## Judges, nominate your team to attend

Addiction has swept into every community and is flooding every court—not just in Indiana, but across our country. Chief Justice Loretta Rush is co-chair of the National Judicial Opioid Task Force and has pledged judicial branch support to fight this public health crisis.

The Indiana Supreme Court is convening teams from each county to attend this important event. A lead judge in every county will nominate a multi-disciplinary team of prosecutors, public defenders, law enforcement, probation officers, Department of Child Services, and medical treatment personnel to attend the summit.

The summit will include training on the science of addiction, evidence-based treatments for substance use disorders including medication assisted treatment, an approved benchcard, resources, and an opportunity for stakeholders to discuss the crisis in their community.
